

WRI India and CESL sign MoU to catalyze India's EV journey

New Delhi, 16 July, 2021: Convergence Energy Services Limited (CESL) and World Resources Institute, India (WRI India), on Friday, signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) to work on strategizing for India's transition towards a net-zero emission trajectory.
